# **Begin Again**

- 1. "Say then with boldness, 'Now I begin,' and go forward constantly in God's service. Do not look back so often, because one who looks back cannot run. And do not be content to begin only for this year. Begin every day, because it is for every day, even for every hour of the day, that the Lord taught us to say in the Our Father, 'Forgive us our trespasses,' and, 'Give us this day our daily bread.'"
- 74. "Do not be surprised at your lack of energy, listlessness and boredom in spiritual things; this is caused by age and physical issues. God does not exempt you from these, because ultimately, it is he himself who procures this for you, and he would be asking something impossible of you. He asks only that you be patient with yourself, that you always begin with a holy tenacity to be faithful in your spiritual practices."
- 58. "Let him walk at the pace that God wishes in all his spiritual practices, however holy they may be, and neither hurry ahead nor hold back from this rate of progress."
- 59. "I would like to take the opportunity of the departure from Turin of your son for some profit, but I do not know what I should say: Should I praise you for your fidelity to God? Ought I chide you? I do not know at all. So I will take a sure part and that is to urge you to begin each day, leaving the past to the mercy of the Lord and the future to his Divine Providence. In the meantime, consider every day that the good God has entrusted you with a mission. In regard to temporal matters, never let anything trouble you, and the same with respect to your faults, taking care to counter them immediately by an act of love of God. Be attentive to practice the virtues of patience and gentleness; you can make a special examination on this in the evening and at midday."

8. "If I should fall a thousand times a day, a thousand times a day I will begin again, with new awareness of my weakness, promising God, with a peaceful heart, to amend my life. I will never think of God as if he were of our condition and grows weary of our wavering, weakness, and negligence. Rather, I will think of what is truly characteristic of him and what he prizes most highly, that is, his goodness and mercy, knowing that he is a loving Father who understands our weakness, is patient with us, and forgives us."

100. "Be persistent in constantly renewing, even daily, and several times a day, your proposals, even if they are always the same and even if you fulfill them very poorly, because in this way you exclude at least the will to continue in your failings; it is precisely this that the Lord desires of you and in which the holiness of which we are capable in this life consists. **This holiness consists not in no longer failing, but in not persevering in the will to fail.** On the contrary, this very persistence in always beginning has something heroic about it."

## Pray and offer sacrifices

- 49. "I will be faithful in making fifteen minutes of meditation every day and fifteen minutes of spiritual reading and the examination of conscience in the evening. I will also attend Mass if I can. It is very right that I give an hour of the day to God when the obligations of my state of life permits it."
- 53. "Every day a chapter of the Gospel of Jesus Christ for reading, and buy a small edition of the New Testament for myself. A great means, easy and powerful for resisting temptation, is to use the Word of God, which is so holy, efficacious, and powerful, as we see in the example of Jesus Christ."

#### Romans 15:4-6

For whatever was written previously was written for our instruction, that by endurance and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to think in harmony with one another, in keeping with Christ Jesus, that with one accord you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

### 2 Corinthians 1:3-7

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and God of all encouragement, who encourages us in our every affliction, so that we may be able to encourage those who are in any affliction with the encouragement with which we ourselves are encouraged by God. For as Christ's sufferings overflow to us, so through Christ does our encouragement also overflow. If we are afflicted, it is for your encouragement and salvation; if we are encouraged, it is for your encouragement, which enables you to endure the same sufferings that we suffer. Our hope for you is firm, for we know that as you share in the sufferings, you also share in the encouragement.

You may choose to pray on one of the Scripture passages assigned for a second time.

### After the prayer:

- What word in Scripture most spoke to my heart?
- What touched my heart in this time of prayer? What did my heart feel as I prayed?
- What did I sense the Lord saying to me?

### Mary and the Sacraments

98. "I desire to have a tender love for the Virgin Mary, and a confidence in her as a son toward his mother, to such a degree that it appear impossible to me that she could permit me to be overcome and that I be lost in the battle."

40. "... at the Consecration those of Christ ..."

43. "... at Communion those of one in love ..."

#### What we should strive for ...

"**Spiritual joy** is a joyous affection of heart produced through sufficient thought about present spiritual goods."

"What are these goods? Participation in the divine nature (as children of God), union with Jesus Christ, being in the bosom of the Church as her sons, God's special protection, the gifts of theological virtues [faith, hope, love], the sacraments, the communion of saints, grace, friendship with God, the merits of our actions, the glory of heaven that is already ours because of the firm hope we have, as a son already possesses the heritage that awaits him from his father."

"[To those who say I cannot be joyful because of my] temperament. I respond that we are not speaking here about a *sensible* joyfulness, but rather of its substance that consists in ridding ourselves of voluntary thoughts of sadness and of

distrust. Think well of God, esteem spiritual goods, something that everyone can do ..."

# **Encourage others and be encouraged by them**

- 4. "We should always keep in our hearts this saying of the Holy Spirit: *Sentite de Deo in bonitate* [Think of God in a spirit of goodness: Wis. 1:1]. And so we should seek sentiments worthy of God first in ourselves so as then to inspire them in others, and attain the goal of loving him and bringing all to love him."
- 57. God has placed me in this state of life; in this and no other I must serve him and be saved. All the circumstances and events in my state of life, such as the different characters of the persons with whom I interact, the events that take place, the times and places in which these occur, reveal the order of Providence through which the Lord has willed to work my salvation. I must adapt myself to all these things and not think that I can force them to adapt themselves to me. And so, I will try always to adapt to these with peace and joy of heart, confident that God knows better than what is best for me."
- 99. Therefore, be of good courage. Let your heart be joyful, give yourself as completely as you can to God, banish any doubts, and tell God that you never wish consciously to do anything that would displease him. For the rest, do not be troubled. God is with you and will help you and will not let you fall."
- 113. "Above all, I have asked the Lord to give you great courage and firm hope in God, so that by this virtue, overcoming all discouragement and striving not to lose that precious time the Lord gives us, you may attain greater good for yourself and for others, especially the Lord has given you so many means for this and the desire to accomplish it."
